Tell Mr. Chaytor I've done my best.

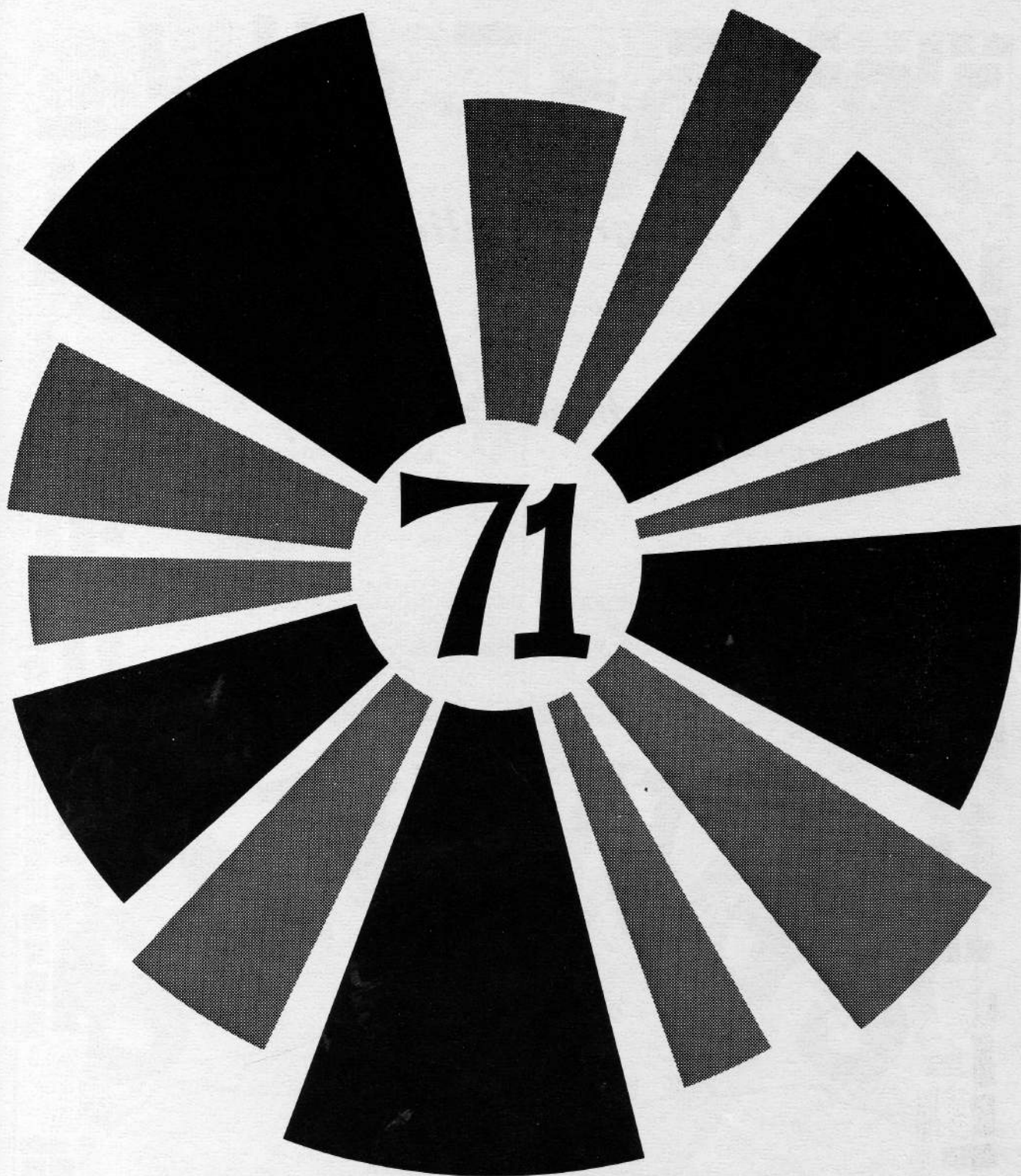
