My thoughts were interrupted when my favorite nurse entered the room. I knew there was something wrong as soon as she came in. Her face was a deadly white and she didn't wear the familiar smile. There was a sinister feeling

about her as soon as she approached me.

She very gently and smpathetically told me what happened. The plane Mom, Dad, and my two brothers were on crashed somewhere out in the Atlantic. There were no survivors. The remark stabbed like a razor in my mind. There, Was, NO SURVIVORS....

The doctors must have give me something to help me sleep. I woke up the next morning with the tragedy still fresh in my mind. I would stare off into space for hours not believing it really happened. Time passed and a new year will soon come. I don't know how I got through those months following my families death. Their is not one minute of the day without I don't think about them. They're always in my mind. I just go from day to day now.

The time is New Year's Eve and I feel lonely. I've been thinking of what happened all day. I dwelth on the past too much already. It didn't do

me any good. I can't change it.

My New Year's Resoulution is to forget about the past and concentrate on the future. Try to build a future for my self and be happy. That is

what my family would have wanted.

My thought was interrupted by a cool breeze blowing off the water. I starred up the hill toward my house and I heard the church bells ringing. They were ringing in the New Year and a new hope, filled my mind.
